



# MINUSEK Military Component Mission

MINUSEK Military Component is initially to establish a safe and secure environment for the stabilization of the EQ KUNDU in order to restore the territorial integrity of the state.

Subsequently the MINUSEK Military Component will assist the EQ KUNDU in the extension of state administration, to facilitate return of IDPs and Refugees, and to conduct free and democratic elections.

MINUSEK Military Component will undertake protection of civilians, ensure prevention of the return of hostile armed elements to the key population centers, in order to enable the EQ KUNDU authorities to develop their capacities and resume their national responsibilities for the population and the State.



# Limitations & preconditions

- UN forces will not undertake offensive counter terrorism operations.
- MINUSEK will not conduct operations in areas of deployment where there are major combat operations by other international forces (French Forces in AOR)
- All airfields and MINUSEK regional offices in EQ Kundu are to be secured by UN military until EQ state authority and territorial integrity is restored



# Concept of operations summary

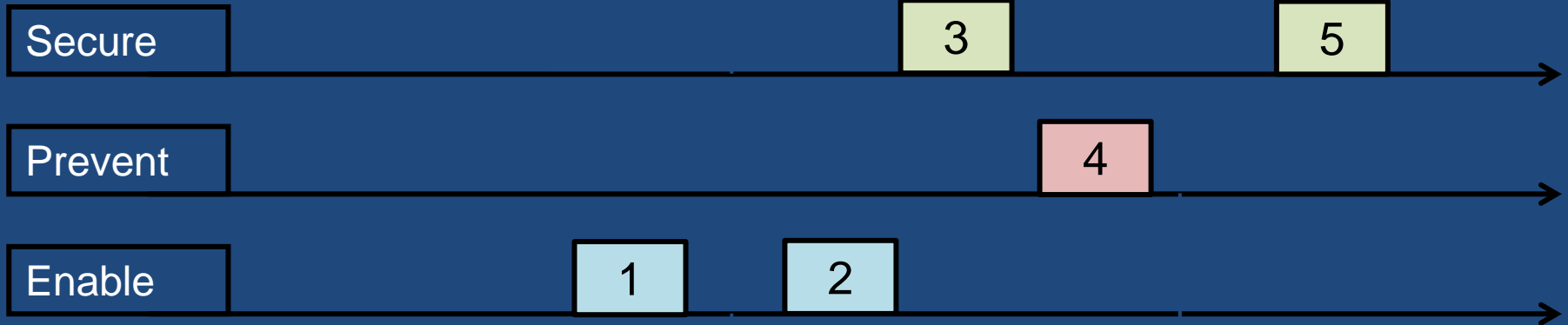
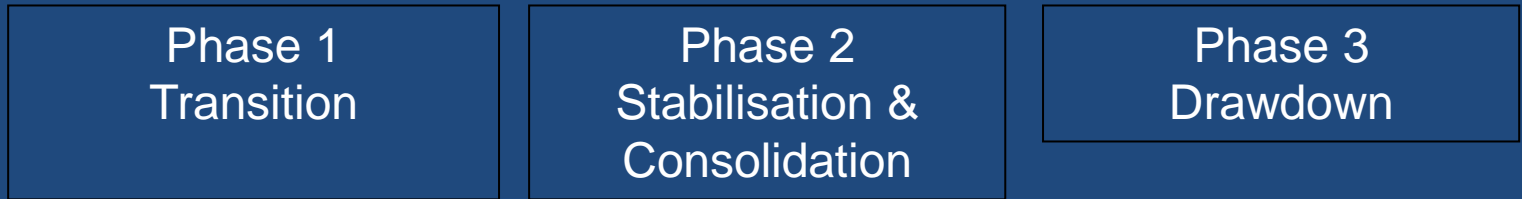
- The military component can use all necessary means within its areas of deployment and capabilities to create a secure environment.
- The military component will secure the major population centres and maintain freedom of movement along connecting Lines Of Communication (LOC).
- MINUSEK will deploy 12,00 military troops and 2000 Police in the 6 major cities in throughtout the area of responsibility (AOR)
- Two Sectors will be established with Sector HQs in Badan (North West) and Azunaka (South East)
- Intelligence-led operations, will be conducted to protect the civilian population, and to deter and actively prevent the return of armed elements.
- A Force Intervention Brigade reserve is to be established in Sector NW, but may be tasked to conduct operations across AOE.
- Units will minimise the number of company level locations



# Concept of operations summary cont.

- MINUSEK is to support the negotiations and implementation of a possible comprehensive peace agreement.
- MINUSEK is also to provide security and logistic support to the IDP camps and elections.
- The parallel French Force will address the terrorist threat together with EK Forces when possible. The French forces will have operational HQs in Badan, Baz-Nkommi and Mireet.
- Coordinated operations with the French and or EK forces will be conducted in strict compliance with applicable international human rights law, international humanitarian law and with the Human Rights Due Diligence Policy on UN-support to non-UN forces (HRDDP).

# Concept of operations (overview)



- 1 Military Component to reach FOC (Full Operational Capability)
- 2 Security and Kundu state authority re-established in key population centres
- 3 Security conditions are re-established throughout the EK state and are conducive for the return of IDPs and to conduct elections
- 4 Residual capacity of hostile armed groups to control key areas reduced
- 5 Kundu institutions have the capacity to assume responsibility for security of the key population centres



# Rules of Engagement

Use force, up to and including deadly force

- To defend (i) yourself , (ii) your unit, (iii) other UN or associated personnel, (iii) members of the transitional authorities of Eo Kundo against (a) a hostile act or a hostile intent or (b) to resist an attempt to abduct or detain them.
- To protect civilians, including IDPs and refugees, under imminent threat of physical violence.
- To protect humanitarian personnel under imminent threat of physical violence.
- To protect UN facilities, installations, equipment, areas or goods against a hostile act or hostile intent that involves a grave threat to life or of serious bodily injury
- To protect key non-UN facilities, installations, areas, equipment or goods designated by the SRSG in consultation with the Force Commander, against a hostile act or hostile intent that involves a grave threat to life or of serious bodily injury.



# Rules of Engagement

Use force, up to and including deadly force

- Against any individual or group that, through the use or threat of the use of armed force, limits or intends to limit the freedom of movement of (i) yourself, (ii) your unit, (iii) other MINUSEK personnel, (iii) members of the transitional authorities of Eq Kundu and (iv) humanitarian personnel. \*
- To protect and stabilize key population centres in support of the transitional authorities of Eq Kundu .
- To prevent the return of armed elements to key population centres in support of the transitional authorities of Eq Kundu .\*
- To support the transitional authorities of Eq Kundu to extend and re-establish State administration throughout the territory.
- To apprehend or prevent the escape of those indicted by the ICC for war crimes and crimes against humanity in Eq Kundu .
- Against any person or group that, through the use or threat of the use of armed force, is preventing or demonstrating intent to prevent you or your unit carrying out lawful orders issued by a superior commander.

\* When and where possible, seek permission from your immediate superior commander.

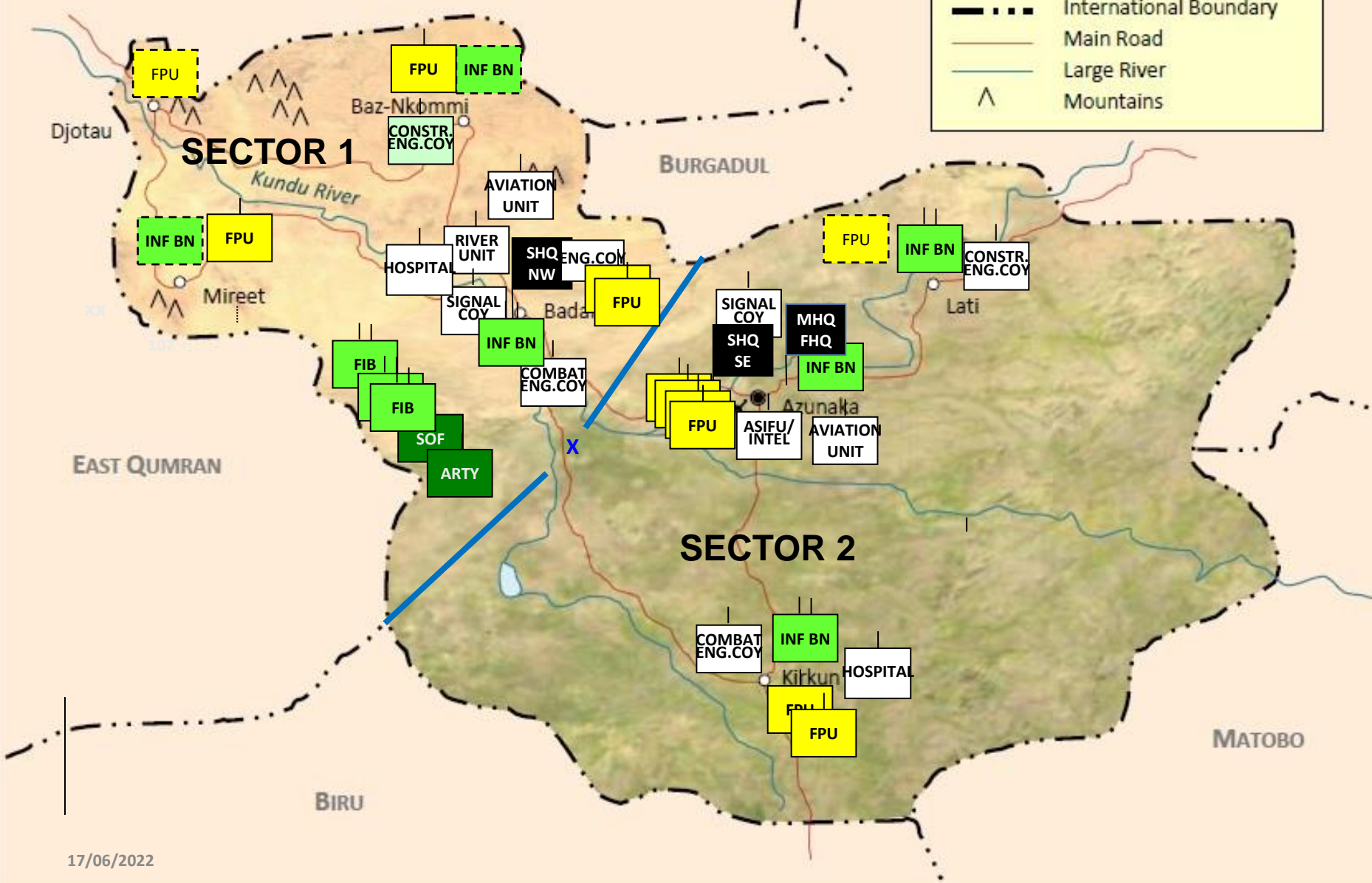
